

#### Town Hall Partial Opening

Beginning June 1, Town staff will be available by phone between 10 AM and 2 PM to answer questions and schedule appointments. If you call and get a message, please leave contact and other pertinent information so staff can respond to your call accordingly. Town staff are available for in-person appointments, which require advanced scheduling and coordination by calling Town Hall.

#### **Utility Billing Information**

The Town Board has approved the below temporary changes to the utility billing policy due to the COVID-19 Emergency Declaration:

- > Late fees are waived during the Disaster Declaration
- Utilities will not be shut off for unpaid utility bills
- Unpaid utility balances will need to be paid in full at the conclusion of the Emergency Declaration in order to avoid future late charges and shut-offs

The on-call number (970-759-3660) is for **utility emergencies ONLY**. If you have utility billing or service questions, please call Town Hall and speak with staff or leave a detailed voicemail; your call will be returned as soon as possible.

#### Face Masks for Ignacio Businesses

The current San Juan Basin Public Health Order requires all employees to wear face masks when working in public. The Town has a limited number of face masks for distribution to businesses needing face masks for employees. If your business needs face masks, please send an email to mallred@townofignacio and provide a business and contact name, phone number, and number of masks needed. Town staff will respond to your request and coordinate the mask delivery.

## Census 2020

## **Property Maintenance**

The Town Municipal Code requires properties to be maintained and managed. This entails lawn maintenance, weed removal and removal of clutter, trash and debris. Also, any digging must first obtain utility clearances by contacting the Utility Notification Center by phone at 811.

## Mosquito Control

Vector Disease Control is contracted through the Town of Ignacio as your mosquito control provider. Please call VCD (970-560-6637) to report mosquito problems. It is important to remove standing water, where mosquitos lay eggs. VCD treats water with larvacide and fogs streets and alleys when mosquitos are present.

#### Carbon Monoxide & Smoke Detectors

According to Colorado State Law, every home must have Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors installed. The smoke alarms must be installed both inside and outside of each sleeping room. Battery operated units should have a new battery installed every six (6) months.

The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program is open for business and accepting new families! For the safety of our families, WIC is conducting existing and new client appointments over the phone. WIC is a supplemental food and nutrition program for pregnant or postpartum women, infants, and children up to age five (5). Pregnant women or families experiencing loss of income may qualify to enroll.
