Town Hall Partial Opening

Town Hall remains closed to the public indefinitely; however, staff is available by phone between 9 AM and 4 PM Monday thru Friday. If you call and get a message, please leave contact and pertinent information so staff can respond to your call accordingly. Town staff are available for in-person appointments, which require advanced scheduling and coordination by calling Town Hall.

Utility Billing Information

The Town Board has approved the below temporary changes to the utility billing policy due to the COVID-19 Emergency Declaration:

- **Late fees are waived during the Disaster Declaration**
- **Utilities will not be shut off for unpaid utility bills**
- **Unpaid utility balances will need to be paid in full at the conclusion of the Emergency Declaration in order to avoid future late charges and shut-offs**

The on-call number (970-759-3660) is for **utility emergencies ONLY**. If you have utility billing or service questions, please call Town Hall and speak with staff or leave a detailed voicemail; your call will be returned as soon as possible.

Email Billing

The Town will begin emailing bills in February. If you would like to receive your utility bill via email, please call the office 9 AM to 4 PM Monday through Friday and give us your name, account number, phone number, and email address. Thanks!

Utility Assistance for Those Impacted by COVID-19

If you lost your job or had a reduction in pay as a direct result of COVID-19 and that loss has impacted your ability to stay current on your utility bills, please contact Town Hall to request possible assistance. The Town will require verification of job loss or reduction in pay. The possibility of this benefit runs out at the end of this year.

If you smell natural gas

in your home or business, leave immediately! Do not turn light switches on or off, especially in the area you smell gas. Do not use your cell phone until you are outside and can no longer smell any gas. Call 911, the Fire Department (563-9501), or Dispatch (563-4401) if you smell gas at any time.

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Carbon Monoxide & Smoke Detectors

According to Colorado State Law, every home must have Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors installed. The smoke alarms must be installed both inside and outside of each sleeping room. Battery operated units should have a new battery installed every six (6) months.

Town Burn Pile

The burn pile is available for disposal of your tree limbs, grass clippings and other organic material. Please note that, if the ground is muddy, access to the Burn Pile will be closed until conditions are satisfactory. To drop off items at the burn pile, please call the on-call number (970-759-3660) to set an appointment.

Online Payments

You can pay your Town utility bill **ONLINE!** Go to the Town's website www.townofignacio.com and look for the "Pay Your Bill Online" link at the bottom of the home page. Snow Removal

The Public Works Department is preparing for snow removal operations. During snow storms, please park your vehicles in your driveway or garage and leave the street clear for snow removal. Also, the Town Code states that it is unlawful to plow, shovel, push, or place snow from privately owned property into any street, road, alley or highway in the Town.
