#### Snow Removal

The Public Works Department is involved in snow removal operations. During snow storms, please park your vehicles in your driveway or garage and leave the street clear for snow plows. Also, the Town Code states that it is unlawful to plow, shovel, push, or place snow from privately owned property into any street, road, alley, or highway in the Town. Please help Town crews as they work hard to keep Town streets clear of snow and safe for your travel. In addition, should snow become placed on your property in an effort from Public Works to keep the streets safe, it is the homeowner's responsibility to remove the snow from their property. Thank you.

#### Low-income Energy Assistance Program

The Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) began on November 1 and will run through April 30, 2024. LEAP is a federally funded program and is administered by Discover Goodwill of Southern and Western Colorado. It is designed to help eligible low-income households with winter home heating costs. #### Online Payments

You can pay your Town utility bill ONLINE! Go to the Town's website towonacio.colorado.gov and look for the "Pay Your Bill Online" link at the bottom of the home You will be page. charged a fee of \$1.00 for electronic checks, and \$0.75 + 2.25% of the transaction for debit or credit payments. If you have a cash payment, you can visit Town Hall between 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM Monday through Friday. Thanks!

**Region 9 Enterprise Zone** Businesses (to include farms & ranches) located in an Enterprise Zone (EZ), may be eligible for State Tax Credits that include: Job Training, Hiring New Employees, Sponsored Health Insurance, Research & Development, Commercial Building Rehabilitation, Commercial Vehicle Investment, Business Personal Property, & Sales and Manufacturing and Mining based on the business location. To be eligible for EZ tax credits, pre-certification and certification is required annually and is filed electronically and approved by the Southwest Enterprise Zone Administrator. To pre-certify or certify, go to https://oedit.my.salesforce-sites.com/oedit/ to access the State's online portal and create a user profile. Submitting information for pre-certification does not obligate a business to earn or use EZ tax credit(s) but **must** be pre-certified to claim them.
