Ignacio Elections

The polling place for the April 5, 2022 election is the Abel F. Atencio Community Room, 570 Goddard Ave. Polls are open from 7AM to 7PM. To confirm your registration status, go to http://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/vote/VoterHome.html and click on "Find my Registration". There is 1 candidate for Mayor and 4 Candidates for Trustee (3 trustee seats are available). There will also be ballot questions concerning the allowance and taxation of recreational and medical marijuana.

Refrigerators will only be accepted if the Freon pump is removed, and it must be tagged by a licensed repairman.

Low-income Energy Assistance Program

The Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) began on November 1 and will run through April 30, 2022. LEAP is a federally funded program and is designed to help eligible low-income households with winter home heating costs. To apply, go to https://cdhs.colorado.gov/leap. They have a limited amount of funds for assistance with water and wastewater as well; the application for that program is also online under Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP).

Carbon Monoxide & **Smoke Detectors**

According to Colorado State Law, every home must have Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors installed. The smoke alarms must be installed both inside and outside of each sleeping room. Battery operated units should have a new battery installed every six (6) months.
